Upcoming Meet Notices

Western Division's next meet will take place on Saturday July 24, 2010 in the Arcadia Senior Center, located at 405 South Santa Anita Avenue, in Arcadia, California.

To get to the meet, exit the 210 Freeway at Santa Anita Avenue. Drive south about half a mile and turn right into the Arcadia Park parking lot. The hall is located next to the lawn bowling area. Look for the Western Division sign.

The display theme for July will be "Convention Cars". Show off an item and facilitate the transfer of knowledge on collecting toy trains with your fellow members. There will be a prize awarded to the best display item, as voted on by the attending members.

Betty Kimball (1912-2010)

One of TCA-Western Divisions' best friends, Betty Kimball, passed away of natural causes on July 1, 2010, at the age of 97.

Born October 14, 1912 in Alhambra, California, Mary Elizabeth Lawyer attended Pasadena Junior College (now Pasadena City College) in the early 1930s. Betty had a strong interest in the dramatic arts, and was involved with the Alhambra Theater and the Pasadena Playhouse. In 1935, she began work in the ink & paint department of the Walt Disney Studios. There, Betty met animator Ward Kimball, who had been hired by Disney a year earlier, and the two were married in 1936. Their marriage would last 66 years, ending with Ward's death on July 8, 2002.

In 1939, Betty left the employment of Disney, to become a full-time homemaker and raise three children, Kelly, John and Chloe. Betty was a great support to Ward and his many projects, including an outstanding toy train collection, the famous Firehouse Five jazz band and the backyard narrow-gauge Grizzly Flats Railroad. All this was in addition to the Disney animation and work on Disneyland that was keeping Ward busy.

After Ward's retirement from Disney in 1972, Betty and Ward were constant companions. She could be depended upon as a helpmate to Ward, especially when they expanded the toy train collection. They built a two-room extension to the garage to separately house the world-class collection of American and European trains. After Ward's untimely passing in 2002, it was Betty who felt that she wanted to stay involved with the 2003 TCA National Convention, hosted by Western Division. Without her help, there would have been no ceramic model of the Grizzly Flats depot, no bus tour of the Kimball family trains, or the heart-felt tribute to Ward that occurred at the Ontario Convention Center in June, 2003.



In remembrance of Betty, members of the Western Division recently contacted the TCA National Toy Train Museum in Strasburg, PA asked that an honorary brick be placed at the museum for Ward and Betty Kimball. The unveiling ceremony will take place in mid-October, 2010, prior to the York, PA meet. **B**etty is remembered as a strong person, who was nevertheless, very unassuming, thoughtful and sweet. She will be missed by all those that knew her. Betty is survived

by her three children and five grandchildren. John Kimball and his wife Virginia have been very active with TCA over the years, and our thoughts are with them and their entire family.
