Editor's Note: This month's cover illustration is attributed to Otto Kuhler (click his name to see the Wikipedia article), famed industrial designer, who created many fabulous streamliners, including the Hiawatha for the Milwaukee Road (shown at left above). Other commissions included the B&O Royal Blue streamlined steamer (Am. Flyer built it in "O" and "S" gauges), the PCC streetcar (MTH) and the GM&O Rebel, which was the inspiration for the LIONEL JR. 1700E in red & chrome. Otto Kuhler was eased out of the industry after WWII, due to his German-sounding name and accent. Later, he became an artist and illustrator. The image at top comes from an AAR booklet called "American Railroads at Work" (1944), that was distributed free to schools across America.


















Collecting LIONEL Hudsons Through the Years, Part 3

e ended Part 2 in 1997 with the production of two Lionel Hudsons, while waiting patiently for a locomotive numbered 773. As Lionel approached its 100th anniversary, the Century Club announced a 773 would be the 5th locomotive in the series. It arrived in 1999, in time for Lionel's 100 year celebration in 2000. We can't forget that Lionel also produced a gold-plated Hudson for the year 2000. Lionel then moved production to China, but in early 2001 they produced a final 773 from remaining Century Club parts. This "Last Hudson made in the USA" is probably the hardest one of all to obtain.



No more could we look at the bottom of a Lionel freight car and read "Made in Chesterfield" or "Made in Mt. Clemens." Frames might read "Made in China" or were totally blank. Lionel production had moved on and more product flooded the market. Old series were continued and new series were started. Electronics exploded and every year brought new features.

In 2005 Lionel offered a remake of the grandest set ever produced in the postwar era. Celebration Series set #6-31739 featured a 773 hauling seven freight cars and was copied from the 1964/65 Super-O set. While the set was a reboot from 1964, the 773 locomotive was more like the 1950 version, with cab numbers in the silver serif font. This locomotive was not offered for separate sale, so if you wanted one you had to buy the set.

This was the final 773 produced by Lionel in the Modern Era, but not the last NYC Hudson made. As the years rolled on and electronic control systems evolved, further Hudsons have been offered. I have not added any of them to my Lionel roster. However, I do continue to add a 773 now and then!

Sales of the CC-773 in 1999 were lower than planned, leaving Lionel with enough parts to assemble about 190 additional pieces.

Lionel changed the trim from Gold to Silver (note the ornamental whistles) and created the "Last Hudson made in the USA."

Almost identical but assigned a unique SKU# these special 773's were sold by just the Top Ten Lionel dealers. Asking price was higher and they still command a big premium in today's market.

Due to the cost of printing and postage, Western Division still requires that those requesting paper copies of the Western Division Newsletters and other correspondence sent out via US Mail; continue to pay an <u>additional fee of \$10.00</u>. The newsletter will now be published 4 times a year to further reduce costs.
